Kocherdal (Kocherthal), Joshua de; w. Sibylle Charlotte and ch. Benigna Sibylle 10, Christian Joshua 7 and Susanna Sibylle 3.

Plettell (Pletel), John Jacob; w. Anne Elisabeth and ch. Margaretha 10, Anna Sara 7 and Catharine 7.

Rennau, Henry; w. Johanna and 2 sisters Sussanna Liboscha 15, and Maria Johanna Liboscha 10; ch. Lorenz 2 and Heinrich 2 mo.

Schwiser (Schwisser), Lorentz; w. Anne Catherine and ch. Johanna 6 mo.

Turk (Turck), Isaac (a bachelor).

Volck, Andrew; w. Anna Catherine, 3 ch. Maria Barabara 5, Heironemus 4 and Anne Gertrude 1.

Weber, Jacob; w. Anna Elisabethe, and 2 daughters, Eva Maria 4 and Eva Elisabethe 1.

Wigand (Weigand), Michael; w. Anne Catherine and ch. Anna Maria 13, Tobias 7 and Georg 5. Also a cousin 22.

14 other Germans left from London with Rev. Kocherthal for New York:

Feber, Isaac; w. Catharine, ch. Abraham 2.

Fiere, Daniel; w. Anna Maria, ch. Andreas 7 and Johannes 6.

Hubertsen, Peter (widower); son Jacob 15.

Rose, Peter; w. Johanna.

Schuneman, Herman (a bachelor)

Wemarin, Maria (Peter's widow), and daughter Catharina 2.
