### **June 1st**

Immanuel Schneider, with Christophel Obel, Macungie (Lehigh County), seeks his two sons, Hansz Henrich, 23 years old, and Philip, 25 years old.

### **August 1<sup>st</sup>**

Johannes Recher, born at Brattle, two miles above Basel, was indentured eleven years ago, along with his brother Friedrich and his sisters, Elisabeth and Margretha. He wishes to hear from them. He is now in Anweil (New Jersey), with Peter Rockenfelder.

### **August 16<sup>th</sup>**

Gottfried Liegeb, Germantown, died from injuries due to falling from a wagon.

Johann Godfrey, Germantown, opposite the printing shop, in Georg Schmitt's houses, sharpens scissors and knives.

Georg Doerr, Tulpehocken (Berks County), advertises that his servant, Frantz Ebler, 25-30 years old, ran away.

### **September 1<sup>st</sup>**

Mattheas Geiger, Salem County (New Jersey), seven miles from the glass house.

Michel Guckes seeks his brothers, Johannes and Henrich.

Andreas Spring, above Trappe, near the stone house.

### **September 16<sup>th</sup>**

Peter Koch, merchant, of Philadelphia, died on the 10<sup>th</sup> at his plantation, along Wissahickon Creek.

Peter Baer, Water street, near Market, Philadelphia, sells hardware.

Andreas Ziegler, Skippack (Montgomery County).

### **October 16<sup>th</sup>**

Alexander Forbes, Philadelphia, advertises that his German servant, Margaret Kleinin, 18 years old, ran away.

Hieronimus Weber, Skippack (Montgomery County), near Jacob Dettweiler.

Abraham Schreiner, Old Goshenhoppen, near Daniel Hiester (Sumneytown, Montgomery County).

Johann Conrad Lorschback, near the stone church, Old Goshenhoppen (Montgomery County).

Georg Frey, Conestoga (Lancaster County), with Bastian Reyer, seeks his sister, Christina Margaretha Freyin, and his brother Peter, and also Maria Frantze Freyin.

Johannes Geschwind, near Willem Goergus, Goshenhoppen (Montgomery County), sells medicines.

Christopher Protzmann, dyer, Lancaster, with Abraham Mayer.

Johannes Eigender, on the Great Lehigh, five miles above Bethlehem, offers his plantation for sale.

Daniel Hill, between the Schuylkill and "Lane Creek".

Daniel Longenecker, on the Schuylkill.

Henrich Bamberger, Upper Salford Township (Montgomery County).

Georg Dennent, Whitemarsh (Montgomery County).

### **November 1<sup>st</sup>**

Georg Adam Weidner, Oley (Berks County), wants a workman for his tile and brick kilns.

Johann Tump and Ernst Hauszkipper, on the North Wales road.

Philip Misze seeks his step-brother, Paulus del Curand, who arrived in this country two years ago. Inquire of Conrad Weiser, at Tulpehocken (Berks County).

Jacob Farni, near Hansz Zimmerman, wants Friedrich Rentz to call for his smithing tools.

Hacob Haart, unmarried, from Heppenheim, near Alzey, arrived in America a year ago. His brother-in-law, Henrich Landes, Perkasio (Bucks County), inquires for him.

Hans Wolff Berlet, miller, arrived in this country seventeen years ago. His brothers, Johann Conrad, papermaker, and Paul, carpenter, have now arrived and seek their brother. Johann Conrad is at Oley (Berks County), with Mer. Womelsdorff.

Wilhelm Ermel, Skippack, on the Branch (of Perkiomen Creek, Montgomery County).

Sebastian Herreman, three miles from Trappe.

Jacob Schuhmacher, Skippack (Montgomery County).
