James Campbell offers a plantation for sale in Tinicum, Bucks County, in Streper's tract.

John Estborn (Eastburn), Norriton, Philadelphia County (now Montgomery), offers a plantation for sale in Durham Township, Bucks County, where Thomas Tad (Todd) lives.

Henrich Scheid, Macungie (Lehigh County).

Jacob Dast, smith, Skippack (Montgomery County), on Isaac Klein's place.

February 16th

Thomas Blaer, Springfield, at Durham, near the furnace, Bucks County, offers a plantation for sale.

Michael Dithart, Saucon, six miles from Durham Furnace, advertises that his German servant, Jacob Hemmerle, a carpenter, ran away.
